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**CITIZEN FORA REPORT FOR MIGORI MUNICIPALITY HELD ON 16TH  
OCTOBER 2025 AT THE ICT HALL, MIGORI.**

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## **1.0 Introduction**

The Municipal Board Chairman officially opened the forum and welcomed all stakeholders present. He appreciated the strong turnout and reaffirmed the Municipality's commitment to participatory governance, transparency and inclusive urban development.

In his remarks, he noted that citizen fora are critical platforms that allow residents to directly engage with municipal leadership on development priorities and service delivery concerns. He emphasized that the completion of Marindi market marks a significant milestone in strengthening local economic growth and improving livelihoods.

The chairman further acknowledged growing public concerns regarding road safety along the highway and assured participants that the Municipality would collaborate with relevant authorities to address speeding and accident-related risks.

## **1.1 Agenda**

### **1.1 .1Utilization and Management of the Completed Marindi Market & Ring Road**

- Municipal Board Members celebrated completion and emphasized transparent stall allocation.
- Municipal Manager outlined operational plans and revenue collection systems.
- Business Community requested fair allocation and involvement in management committees.
- The public called for affordable rents and improved sanitation.
- Women & Youth Representatives advocated for priority access and mentorship programs.

- PWD Representatives appreciated accessibility features and requested continuous monitoring.

### **1.1.2 Curbing Accidents Caused by Speeding Vehicles on the Highway**

- Transport Operators acknowledged speeding concerns but asked for balanced enforcement.
- The County Government Staff shared accident statistics and committed to installing safety measures.
- Municipal Board Members suggested collaboration with traffic police and community monitoring.
- Youth Representatives volunteered to lead awareness campaigns.
- Women Representatives highlighted family impacts and called for pedestrian crossings.
- PWD Representatives requested tactile paving and audible signals at crossings.
- General Public shared personal experiences and supported immediate interventions.

### **1.2 Key Outcomes**

After serious discussions, the following resolutions were reached;

- That the Marindi Market is now complete and the focus now shifts to management, accessibility, and sustainability.
- There is need for a consensus on fair stall allocation and affordable rents.
- Need for unified call for urgent road safety measures combining enforcement, infrastructure, and awareness.
- Recognition of inclusivity as a guiding principle in both market operations and road safety.

### **1.3 Action Points**


- Establish a market management committee.
- Develop an inclusive stall allocation policy.
- Implement sanitation and waste management plan for the market.

- Install speed bumps, signage, and pedestrian crossings on the highway.
- Conduct continuous road safety awareness campaigns led by youth, women, and PWD groups.
- Ensure accessibility improvements such as ramps, tactile paving, and audible signals.

#### 1.4 Closing Remarks

The forum celebrated the completion of Marindi Market as a milestone for local economic growth. Discussions emphasized that the real success lies in inclusive management and sustainable operations. On road safety, participants agreed that saving lives requires a mix of infrastructure, enforcement, and community-driven awareness.
